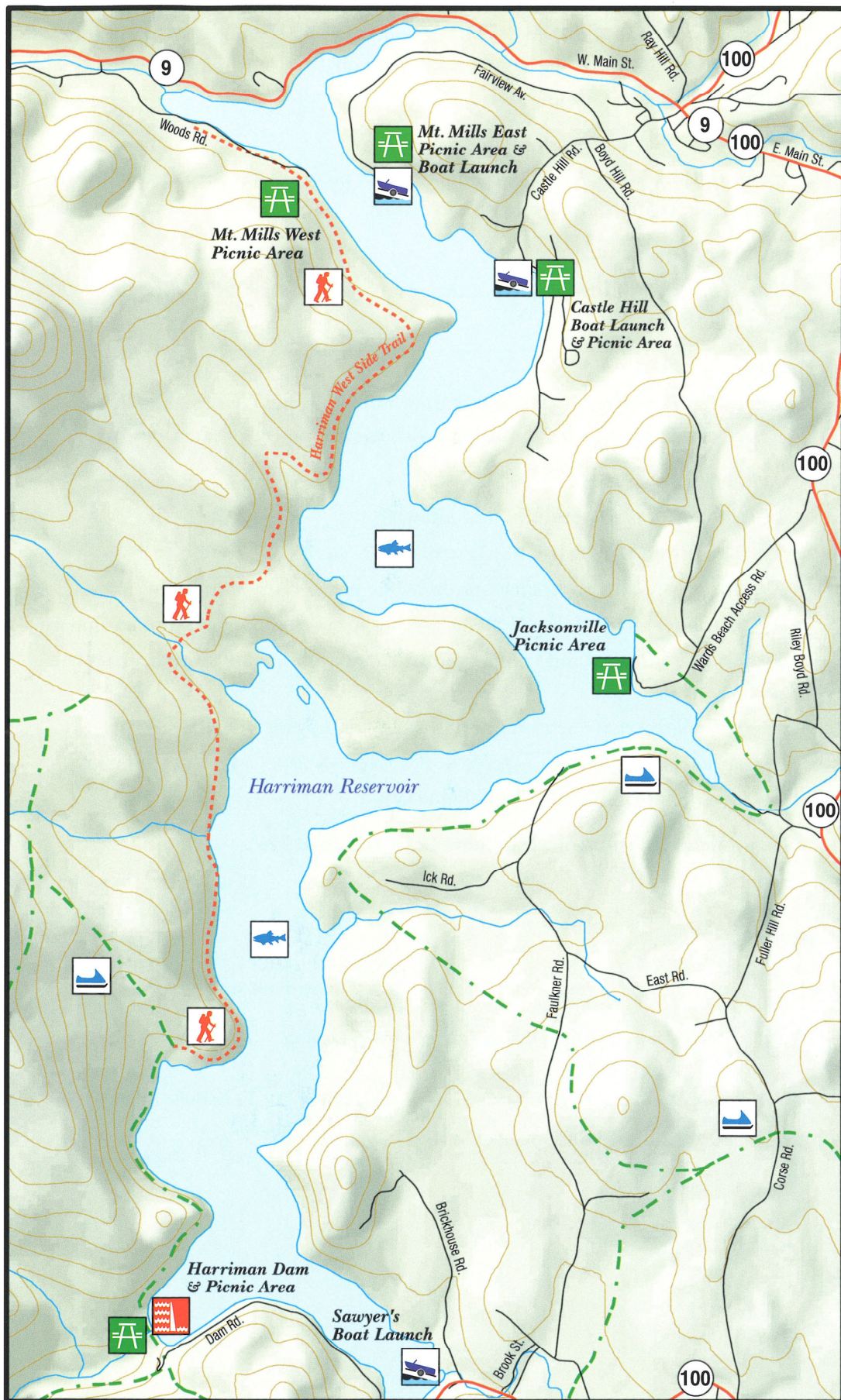


Map 13 HARRIMAN RESERVOIR



HARRIMAN RESERVOIR

Located in Wilmington and Whitingham, Vermont. Primary access points for recreational facilities are off Routes 9 and 100. Seasonal operation from Memorial Day to Labor Day.

Recreation

Facilities include several boat launches and picnic areas with opportunities for hiking, fishing and boating.

Natural Features

There are mountain views from the reservoir and abundant waterfowl and wildlife.

History

Harriman Reservoir is the largest man-made, wholly-contained body of water in Vermont. It was built for hydroelectric power production in 1924.

Access and Safety

- Daytime use only—camping not allowed.
- PFDs required by Coast Guard regulations.
- Grill fires are allowed in designated picnic areas if fire danger permits.
- All-terrain vehicles and trail bikes are not allowed on any trails or property.
- Fishermen, hunters and trappers must carry appropriate state licenses and permits.
- River flows fluctuate seasonally, daily and sometimes hourly.
- Water levels may change rapidly in the rivers—especially near dams.
