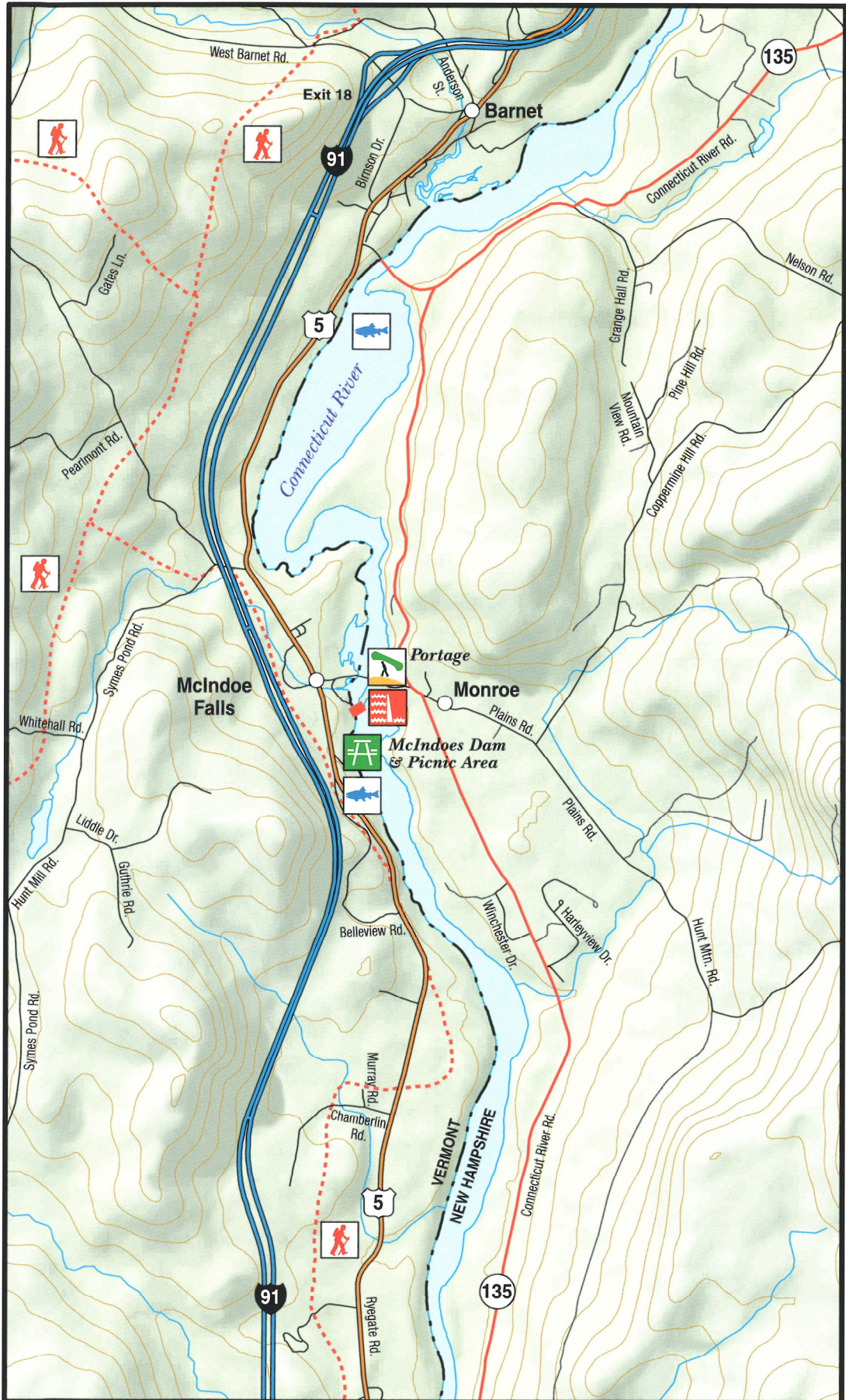


Map 6 MCINDOES STATION



MCINDOES STATION

McIndoes station is in the town of Barnet, Vermont. If traveling north on Route 91, take exit 17 then 302 east to route 5 north. Take a right at the village of McIndoes (toward Monroe.) The dam will be on your right. If traveling south on Route 91, take exit 18 toward Barnet to Route 5 south. Take a left at the village of McIndoes. The dam will be on your right.

Recreation

There's a quiet, sheltered, walk-in fishing area and a picnic area.

Features

McIndoes was built in 1931 as a “regulating” dam. This means that its flow is regulated to help even out flows from the river and two dams above. Below McIndoes, all dams are “run of the river”—meaning that the release at the dam equals the inflows that are coming toward the dam. During flood conditions, the reservoir level can be dropped to relieve downstream flooding.

Safety

- Daytime use only—camping not allowed.
- PFDs required by Coast Guard regulations.
- Grill fires are allowed in designated picnic areas if fire danger is low.
- All-terrain vehicles and trail bikes are not allowed on any trails or property.
- Fishermen, hunters and trappers must carry appropriate state licenses and permits.
- River flows fluctuate seasonally, daily and sometimes hourly.
- Water levels may change rapidly in the rivers—especially near dams.

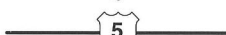
