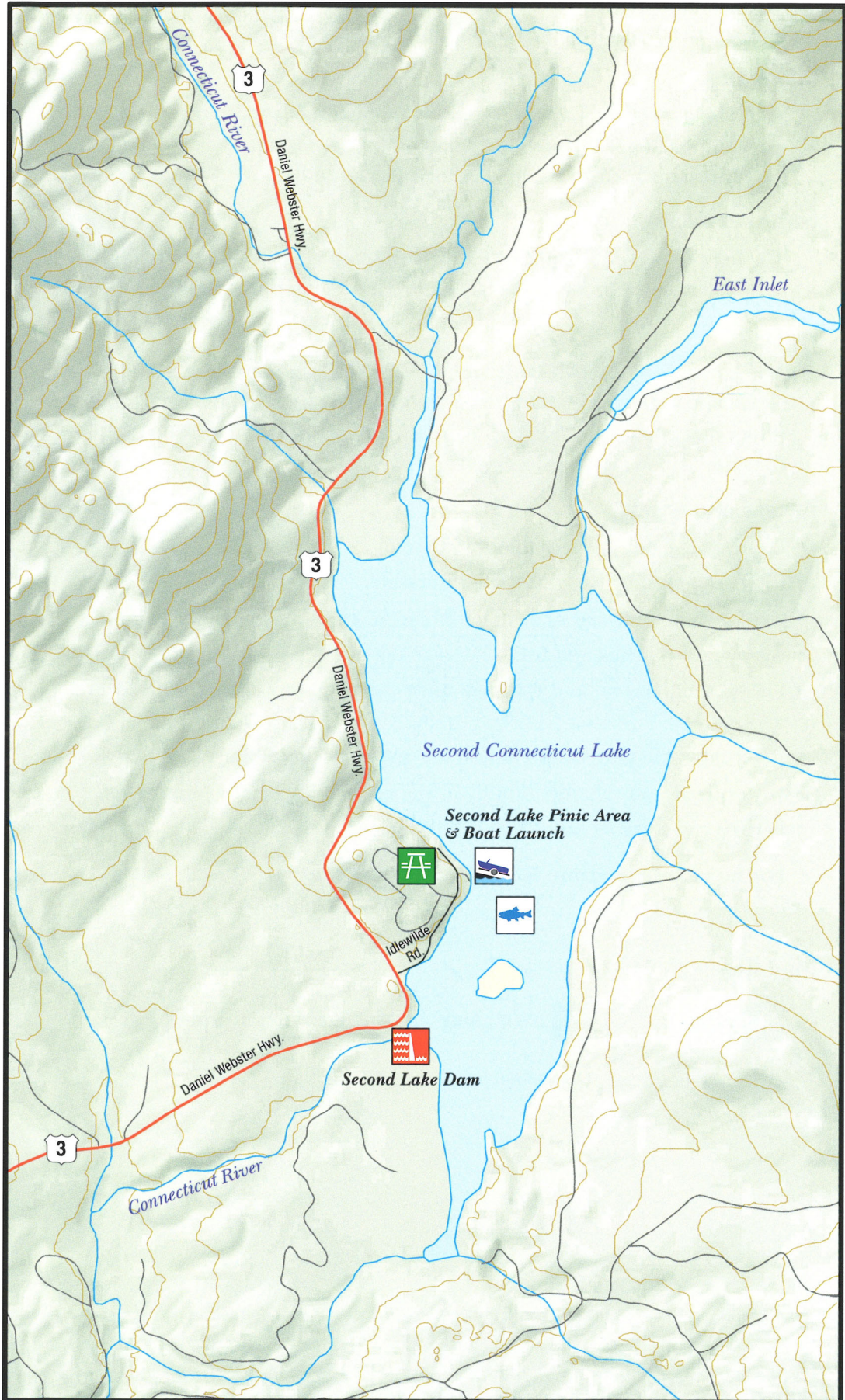


Map 1 SECOND CONNECTICUT LAKE



SECOND CONNECTICUT LAKE

Located north of Pittsburg, New Hampshire off Route 3.

Recreation

Second Connecticut Lake is a remote, uninhabited and pristine lake with excellent fishing, canoeing and small craft boating. There is a picnic area and boat launch north of the dam on Idlewilde Road.

Natural Features

The lake is located in an area known as Moose Alley, and visitors may see moose. There are many birds such as great blue herons, eagles, and loons.

History

The lake was developed to accumulate logs for log drives down the Connecticut River. The water levels were later raised to increase stored water that could be released during the dry season to help insure continuous flows in the Connecticut River.

Access and Safety

- Daytime use only—camping not allowed.
- PFDs required by Coast Guard regulation.
- Grill fires are allowed in designated picnic areas if fire danger is low.
- All-terrain vehicles and trail bikes are not allowed on any trails or property.
- Fishermen, hunters and trappers must carry appropriate state licenses and permits.
- River flows fluctuate seasonally, daily and sometimes hourly.
- Water levels may change rapidly in the rivers—especially near dams.
