
Map 10 VERNON STATION



VERNON STATION

Vernon Station is located off Route 142 between Vernon and North Vernon, Vermont — just over the Massachusetts border. Traveling north, take exit 18 (in Massachusetts) off Route 91 to Route 10 east to Route 142 north. Traveling south, take exit 1 (in Vermont), travel north on Route 5 briefly and then take a right onto Route 142 south.

Recreation

There's a boat launch and picnic area, portage trail, visitor information kiosk and a small area for viewing fish in the fish ladder.

Natural Features

The fish ladder at Vernon provides migratory fish a passageway on their journey along the Connecticut River. Fish can sometimes be seen making their way up the river between Memorial Day and the 4th of July, depending on water temperature and many other variables.

History

The station was built in 1909 and is among the oldest hydro plants on the Connecticut river.

Safety

- Daytime use only—camping not allowed.
- PFDs required by Coast Guard regulations.
- Grill fires are allowed in designated picnic areas if fire danger permits.
- All-terrain vehicles and trail bikes are not allowed on any trails or property.
- Fishermen, hunters and trappers must carry appropriate state licenses and permits.
- River flows fluctuate seasonally, daily and sometimes hourly.
- Water levels may change rapidly in the rivers—especially near dams.
